IGUAZÚ FALLS

(ARGENTINE SIDE)

OVERVIEW

This unforgettable experience includes round-trip transfers from your downtown hotel or any along the route to the park. As we journey to the Falls, your expert guide will share fascinating insights about the National Park, its incredible flora and fauna, and the highlights you simply can't miss.

IGUAÇU, FOZ DO IGUAÇU, BRAZIL

INBOUND

IGUAZÚ FALLS

(BRAZILIAN SIDE)

OVERVIEW

The park covers an area of 175,000 hectares. There, you'll be amazed by the care, beauty, and vastness of the park, home to countless animal and plant species. Nature will greet you with the welcome of friendly butterflies that flaunt their flight and delight you with their colors. Since 80% of the waterfalls are on the Argentine side, the Brazilian park has a single walkway of approximately 1,000 meters, from which you can enjoy the various panoramic views.



ITINERARY

Two departures daily: one **in the morning** starting at 7:30 a.m. and returning at 3:30 p.m. Another departure **in the afternoon** at 1:30 p.m. Return at 7:30 p.m. Approximate times subject to change depending on hotel location, immigration procedures, and other matters. Includes round-trip hotel transportation and professional guide service.

At the end of the hike, opposite Floriano Falls, there is a viewpoint accessible via an elevator, offering one of the most impressive views of the falls. Lunch is optional and not included. For all excursions, we recommend bringing insect repellent, sneakers, and comfortable clothing.

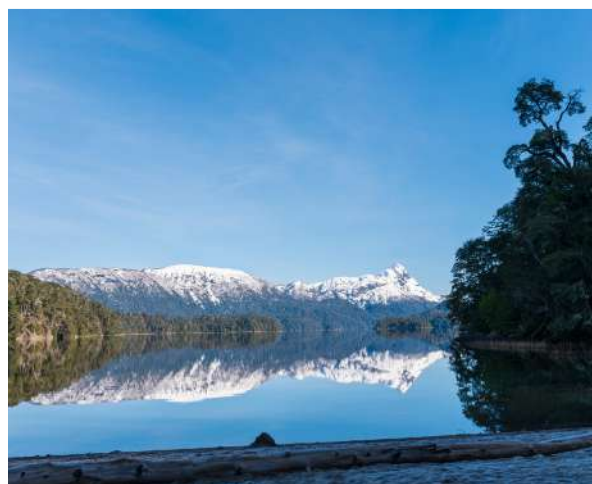
BARILOCHE, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

VILLA TRAFUL & VILLA LA ANGOSTURA

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion offers an in-depth exploration of Northern Patagonia, combining dramatic Andean landscapes, pristine lakes and charming mountain villages. Departing from San Carlos de Bariloche, the journey follows iconic scenic routes through river valleys, forests and lakeshores, delivering panoramic viewpoints and cultural highlights in a single, well-balanced day.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The tour departs from San Carlos de Bariloche along National Route 40, skirting Lake Nahuel Huapi and following the Limay River valley. Key stops include the natural rock formations of El Anfiteatro and the Enchanted Valley, as well as panoramic viewpoints overlooking Lake Traful from Mirador del Viento. After free time in the village of Villa Traful for lunch or refreshments, the route continues through Puerto Arrayán and El Portezuelo, joining the renowned Seven Lakes Route. The journey passes Lakes Espejo and Correntoso before reaching Villa La Angostura, where guests enjoy free time to explore the town. The return to Bariloche follows scenic lakefront roads with views of the Huemul Peninsula, completing a comprehensive Patagonian experience in one day.



CALAFATE, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

PERITO MORENO GLACIER

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion from El Calafate offers a comprehensive visit to Perito Moreno Glacier, one of Patagonia's most iconic natural landmarks. Traveling through Patagonian steppe and Andean forest landscapes, the tour combines scenic drives, wildlife observation and optional navigation, culminating in extended time at the glacier's panoramic walkways.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The journey departs from El Calafate along a fully paved road toward Los Glaciares National Park, passing Lake Argentino and Redonda Bay, an area known for birdlife and typical Patagonian steppe scenery. After entering the national park, the landscape transitions into Andean-Patagonian forest, leading to the first panoramic viewpoint of Perito Moreno Glacier.

A brief stop is made at the initial viewpoint before continuing to Puerto Bajo las Sombras, where an optional one-hour navigation along the southern arm of the Canal de los Témpanos may be added, offering close-up views of the glacier's ice wall. The excursion then continues to the main visitor area, featuring an extensive network of balconies and footbridges that provide multiple perspectives of the glacier. Guests enjoy free time for walks and optional lunch before returning to El Calafate.



CALAFATE, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

NAVIGATION GLACIERS GOURMET

OVERVIEW

Glaciares Gourmet is a premium full-day navigation experience on Lake Argentino, designed to showcase the most impressive glaciers of Los Glaciares National Park while combining comfort, scenery and optional gourmet dining. This excursion offers an in-depth exploration of remote glacier fronts, panoramic lake navigation and the possibility of complementing the experience with a guided visit to the Perito Moreno Glacier walkways.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The tour begins at Puerto La Soledad (Punta Bandera area), where passengers board the vessel in the morning and navigate across Lake Argentino, crossing the narrow Devil's Throat and sailing through scenic bays framed by mountains and historic estancias. The route continues through the Spegazzini Channel, offering views of the Seco, Heim and Spegazzini glaciers, the tallest glacier in the national park.

A guided walk is included at Puesto Las Vacas, allowing time to explore the area's natural environment and early settler remains. Navigation then proceeds along the Upsala Channel, with panoramic views of Upsala Glacier and its icebergs, during which a gourmet lunch may be served if booked.

The final navigation approaches the Perito Moreno Glacier from its northern face via the Icebergs Channel, providing a unique perspective of the ice front. Passengers may either continue by boat back to Puerto La Soledad or opt for a disembarkation at Puerto Perito Moreno to visit the glacier walkways with a bilingual guide before returning to El Calafate.



CALAFATE, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

MINITREKKING EXPERIENCE (WALK ON THE PERITO MORENO GLACIER)

SEASON: JULY 15 TO MAY 31 DURATION: 9 AND A HALF HOURS. DEPARTURES: DAILY FROM HOTELS

OVERVIEW

This full-day adventure offers a unique opportunity to walk on the Perito Moreno Glacier, combining navigation, guided trekking on ice and panoramic viewpoints. Designed for active travelers, the experience includes a glacier crossing with certified mountain guides, exploration of ice formations, and a guided visit to the glacier walkways, delivering one of Patagonia's most immersive and iconic outdoor experiences.

CONSIDER:

- *Of medium physical demand, suitable for people from 8 to 65 years old exclusively.*
- *Not suitable for overweight people, pregnant women, people with any degree or type of physical or mental disability that affects their attention, gait and/or coordination. People who suffer from central or peripheral cardiovascular diseases, whose cardiac or vascular capacities are diminished, or who use stents, bypasses, pacemakers or other prostheses. Example: anticoagulant medications, grade III varicose veins (those that appear thick and multiple).*
- *People who suffer from diseases caused by respiratory disabilities (COPD, asthma, emphysema, etc.).*

ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion departs from El Calafate with a transfer to Puerto Bajo de las Sombras, where guests cross Lake Rico by boat in front of the southern face of the Perito Moreno Glacier. Upon arrival, certified mountain guides lead a short walk along the lakeshore and provide a briefing on glaciology and safety procedures.

Participants are then equipped with crampons and helmets and begin a guided ice trek on the glacier, lasting approximately one and a half hours. During the walk, guests explore typical glacial formations such as crevasses, seracs and meltwater lagoons. After the ice walk, the route continues through Andean Patagonian forest back to the shelter.

The excursion concludes with a return boat crossing and a guided visit to the Perito Moreno Glacier walkways, allowing time to enjoy panoramic viewpoints before returning to El Calafate.

PUERTO MADRYN, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

FULL DAY PIRAMIDES

AVAILABLE FROM MID-JUNE TO LATE SEPTEMBER.

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion explores Península Valdés, one of Argentina's most important natural reserves and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The tour combines coastal landscapes, Patagonian wildlife and the unique atmosphere of Puerto Pirámides, offering an excellent introduction to the Atlantic Patagonian ecosystem and its seasonal marine life.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion begins with a drive to Península Valdés, entering the reserve at the Ameghino Isthmus Interpretation Center, where guests enjoy panoramic views of Golfo Nuevo and Golfo San José. The route continues through the peninsula, offering opportunities to observe native wildlife such as guanacos, rheas and maras in their natural habitat.

The tour proceeds to Puerto Pirámides, the only village within the reserve, where guests have free time for lunch or to explore the coastal surroundings. Depending on the season and wildlife conditions, the itinerary may include a visit to a sea lion colony at Punta Pirámide or a coastal stop at Doradillo for whale watching from shore, before returning to the city.

PUERTO MADRYN, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

PUNTA TOMBO

AVAILABLE FROM MID-SEPTEMBER TO MID-APRIL.

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion visits Punta Tombo, home to the world's largest Magellanic Penguin colony. The tour offers close-up observation of hundreds of thousands of penguins in their natural habitat, walking along marked trails through a unique coastal landscape. The experience can be enhanced with optional cultural, wildlife or museum visits, making it a flexible and highly attractive option for nature and wildlife-focused travelers.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion departs in the morning from Puerto Madryn, traveling south along mostly paved roads to the Punta Tombo Magellanic Penguin Reserve. Upon arrival, guests explore the colony via marked trails that allow safe and close observation of penguins as they nest, interact and move between land and sea. Time is available to walk the reserve and enjoy lunch on site.

Depending on the selected option, the tour may be combined with an additional activity such as a visit to Isla Escondida, a stop in the Welsh town of Gaiman, a visit to the Egidio Feruglio Paleontological Museum, or a tonina (Commerson's dolphin) watching excursion in Rawson. The return to Puerto Madryn takes place in the late afternoon.

TIERRA DEL FUEGO, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

TIERRA DEL FUEGO NATIONAL PARK AND END OF THE WORLD TRAIN RIDE

OVERVIEW

Embark on an unforgettable journey through the breathtaking landscapes of Tierra del Fuego! This adventure combines scenic views, charming walks, and iconic landmarks — perfect for nature lovers and photography enthusiasts.



ITINERARY HIGHLIGHTS:

- **Bahía Ensenada:** Marvel at the stunning scenery of this picturesque bay.
- **Lago Roca:** Enjoy a peaceful lakeside walk surrounded by majestic mountains — a paradise for photographers.
- **Centro de Visitantes:** Relax with a snack or browse local souvenirs while soaking in panoramic views of forests, rivers, and mountains.
- **Scenic Drive: Explore Río Lapataia,** Archipelago Cormoranes, Laguna Verde, and Río Ovando, with plenty of stops for photos and fresh air.
- **Bahía Lapataia & Ruta Nacional 3:** Capture the moment at the southernmost point of the Pan-American Highway, with the iconic sign marking the distance between Ushuaia and Alaska — a must for your travel memories!
- **End of the world train:** This experience will allow you to explore an inaccessible part of Tierra del Fuego National Park while enjoying the unique charm of a vintage railway.

TIERRA DEL FUEGO, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

NAVIGATION IN THE BEAGLE CHANNEL WITH MINITREKKING IN THE BRIDGES ISLANDS

OVERVIEW

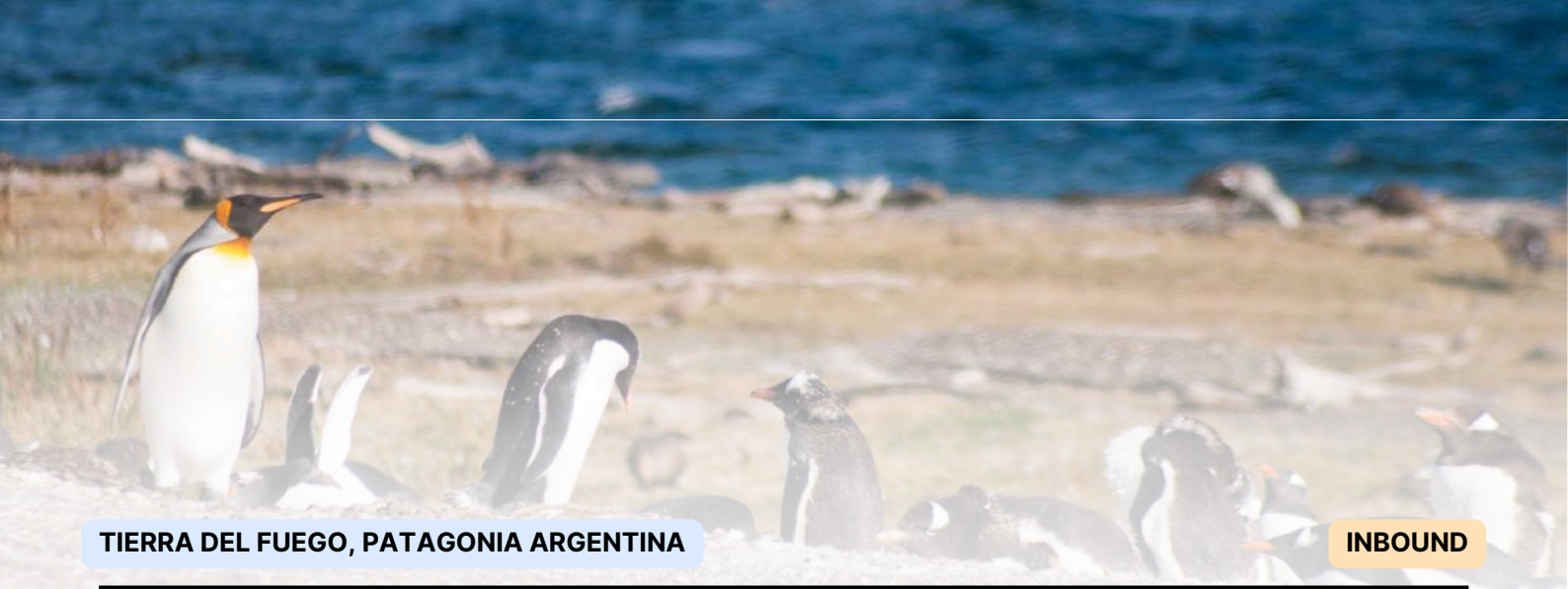
This scenic navigation through the Beagle Channel offers an ideal introduction to the wildlife, history and landscapes of Tierra del Fuego. Combining marine wildlife observation, short guided walks and iconic landmarks, the excursion provides a balanced experience suitable for cruise passengers and short-stay visitors in Ushuaia.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion departs from the local tourist dock, crossing Ushuaia Bay and entering the Beagle Channel via Paso Chico. Navigation continues around Bird Island, home to a variety of Fuegian seabirds, followed by Sea Lion Island, where colonies of sea lions can be observed at close range.

The route proceeds to the Les Éclaireurs Lighthouse, where guests learn about the 1930 shipwreck of the SS Monte Cervantes while viewing cormorant colonies. A landing is made at Puerto Karelo, part of the Bridges Islands, for a short guided walk to visit Yamana shell middens and enjoy panoramic viewpoints. The return navigation offers sweeping views of the mountain range surrounding Ushuaia, highlighting the region's natural beauty and historical significance.



TIERRA DEL FUEGO, PATAGONIA ARGENTINA

INBOUND

NAVIGATION TO THE PENGUINS ISLAND WITH WALKING

OVERVIEW

The Beagle Channel between Argentina and Chile is home to a string of small islands rich with bird colonies, marine mammals and dramatic Patagonian landscapes.

It is a mixed boat/bus tour that visits several highlights of the channel, giving visitors a chance to see sea birds, sea-lions and penguins and to experience the rugged scenery of Tierra del Fuego.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

This combined boat and overland excursion explores the highlights of the Beagle Channel and the surrounding landscapes of Tierra del Fuego. The experience includes navigation among wildlife-rich islands, iconic landmarks and scenic drives through Patagonian terrain.

The journey features navigation around Bird Island, home to year-round colonies of cormorants and other seabirds, followed by Sea Lion Island, where visitors observe sea-lion colonies at close range. The route continues past the iconic Les Éclaireurs Lighthouse, often referred to as the “Lighthouse at the End of the World.”

The excursion also includes a visit to Isla Martillo, home to the only penguin colony near Ushuaia, with Magellanic and Gentoo penguins nesting during the austral summer. After the maritime portion, the tour continues by road along Ruta 3 and the scenic, unpaved Ruta J, offering panoramic views of steppe, forests, lakes, mountains and the Beagle Channel, before returning to Ushuaia.

ARGENTINA > CHILE

INBOUND

ANDEAN CROSSING BARILOCHE – PUERTO VARAS

OVERVIEW

The Andean Crossing from Bariloche to Puerto Varas is one of Patagonia's most iconic transnational journeys, combining lake navigation, mountain landscapes and a historic route across the Andes. Traveling through Argentine and Chilean National Parks, the experience links both countries via a scenic mix of land and water transfers, offering an unforgettable passage through lakes, forests and volcanic scenery.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The journey begins in San Carlos de Bariloche with a land transfer to Puerto Pañuelo, followed by navigation across Lake Nahuel Huapi to Puerto Blest. After arrival, the route continues overland to Puerto Alegre and across Lake Frías, reaching Puerto Frías where Argentine exit formalities take place.

The crossing then proceeds by land through the Andes to Villa Peulla, located within Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park, where Chilean entry procedures are completed. From Peulla, passengers navigate Lake Todos los Santos to Puerto Petrohué, enjoying views of volcanoes and Andean landscapes. The final leg is a land transfer along Lake Llanquihue to the city of Puerto Varas, marking the end of this historic Andean journey.



PUERTO MONTT, CHILE

INBOUND

PETROHUE FALLS + CITY TOUR AT PUERTO MONTT

OVERVIEW

This half-day excursion combines Patagonian nature and local culture, showcasing volcanoes, lakes and waterfalls in the Lake District of southern Chile. Departing from Puerto Montt, the tour highlights the scenic beauty of Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park alongside a guided city tour, offering a well-balanced experience in a single day.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion departs from Puerto Montt, traveling along Route 5 toward Puerto Varas, known as the “City of Roses.” A stop at the main square provides panoramic views of Lake Llanquihue and Osorno Volcano. The route continues to Ensenada, with a viewpoint stop at Los Riscos, followed by a visit to the tranquil Green Lake.

The journey then enters Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park, where guests explore the Petrohué Falls and admire the turquoise waters of Todos los Santos Lake. On the return to Puerto Montt, the tour includes a guided city visit featuring the Plaza de Armas, colorful waterfront houses and the neoclassical cathedral, before concluding in the city.

PUERTO MONTT, CHILE

INBOUND

VOLCANO OSORNO AND PETROHUE

OVERVIEW

This scenic excursion explores the heart of Chile's Lake District, combining volcanic landscapes, alpine lakes and iconic waterfalls. The tour highlights Osorno Volcano and Petrohué Falls within Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park, offering a perfect balance of nature, photography and relaxed exploration in a single day.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion begins with hotel pick-up and a drive along Route 5 toward Puerto Varas, with panoramic views of Lake Llanquihue and the surrounding volcanoes. The route continues up the slopes of Osorno Volcano, where guests enjoy scenic viewpoints and time for photography.

The journey proceeds to the Green Lagoon, followed by free time in Ensenada for a short walk and optional lunch. The tour then enters Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park to visit the Cascade of Lovers and the renowned Petrohué River Falls, known for their turquoise waters and volcanic rock formations. If time permits, a final stop is made at Todos los Santos Lake before returning to the ship.



PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

INBOUND

CONDORS OF PATAGONIA WATCHING

OVERVIEW

This unique wildlife experience offers one of the most accessible and reliable opportunities in the world to observe and photograph the Andean Condor, the largest flying bird on the planet. Located just over an hour from Punta Arenas, the excursion combines conservation, education and close-up wildlife viewing in a protected natural environment within Chilean Patagonia.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

travels by road to Estancia Olga Teresa, home to the largest condor roost ("Condorera") in Chilean Patagonia. Upon arrival, guests enjoy a short introductory presentation with a coffee break, providing insight into the biology, behavior and conservation of the Andean Condor.

A gentle walk of less than 500 meters leads to the base of the rock wall where condors roost. Guided by specialized researchers, guests observe condors using a powerful telescope and professional binoculars provided on site. The guide identifies individual birds and explains their habits, while visitors have the opportunity to capture close-up photographs through the telescope using their own cameras or smartphones.

PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

INBOUND

GREY GLACIER

OVERVIEW

This navigation to Grey Glacier is one of the must-do experiences in Torres del Paine National Park, offering close-up views of one of the largest glaciers in the region. Sailing among floating icebergs on the milky waters of Grey Lake, the excursion combines dramatic glacial scenery, Patagonian landscapes and a relaxed navigation experience suitable for most travelers.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion begins with check-in at Hotel Lago Grey, followed by a walk across a suspension bridge and through forest trails to reach the lakeshore. Depending on seasonal conditions, access to the boat may involve a beach walk or a short transfer by support boat. Once on board the Grey III vessel, navigation across Grey Lake begins.

The boat sails among icebergs toward the Grey Glacier, part of the Southern Patagonian Ice Field. Upon reaching the glacier front, the vessel remains in position for approximately one hour, allowing guests to observe the glacier's deep blue tones, crevasses and ice formations while enjoying the surrounding mountain scenery. A drink is served on board during navigation.

The return journey follows the same route back to the starting point. One-way navigation options are also available, connecting Grey Beach with Refugio Grey or Hotel Lago Grey, making this excursion ideal for travelers combining navigation with trekking routes inside the national park.



PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

INBOUND

KING PENGUIN PARK

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion offers a unique opportunity to visit the only permanent King Penguin colony in Chile, located on the remote island of Tierra del Fuego. Combining scenic ferry crossings, Patagonian landscapes and wildlife observation, the tour provides an in-depth exploration of the region's natural and cultural heritage, making it an exceptional experience for nature and wildlife enthusiasts.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion begins with an early departure to Tres Puentes terminal, where guests board a ferry to cross the historic Strait of Magellan to Porvenir on Tierra del Fuego Island. Upon arrival, the tour includes a visit to the Fernando Cordero Rusque Museum, showcasing local fauna, gold mining history and the culture of the Selk'nam people.

After lunch in Porvenir, the journey continues along Bahía Inútil, crossing vast pampas landscapes dotted with sheep ranches, birdlife and guanaco herds. The route leads to King Penguin Park, home to a permanent colony of King Penguins, where guests observe these impressive birds in their natural habitat, with the possibility of seeing chicks during the summer season.

The return journey heads toward Primera Angostura, the narrowest point of the Strait of Magellan, followed by a short ferry crossing back to the mainland. The excursion concludes with a scenic drive back to Punta Arenas.

PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

INBOUND

TORRES DEL PAINE

OVERVIEW

This full-day excursion offers a comprehensive introduction to Torres del Paine National Park, combining natural history, wildlife observation and some of Patagonia's most iconic landscapes. From prehistoric caves to granite towers, waterfalls, lakes and glaciers, the tour showcases the diversity and dramatic beauty of southern Chile in a single, well-structured day.



ITINERARY SUMMARY

The excursion departs from Puerto Natales and begins with a visit to Milodón's Cave, a vast natural cavern known for the discovery of remains of the prehistoric giant sloth and other extinct species. After a guided walk inside the cave, the journey continues toward Cerro Castillo, with a stop at a local cafeteria.

The route then heads toward Torres del Paine National Park, crossing estancias and transitioning from Patagonian steppe to deciduous forest, with opportunities to spot native wildlife such as guanacos and rheas. Upon entering the park, guests explore a landscape of colorful lagoons, ice-covered mountains and abundant fauna.

Inside the park, the excursion includes a short walk to Salto Grande on the Paine River, followed by lunch. In the afternoon, the tour continues to Lake Grey, where guests enjoy a walk to a panoramic viewpoint overlooking floating icebergs and Grey Glacier. The return to Puerto Natales follows scenic lake routes, concluding a full and varied Patagonian experience.
